School Attendance As we are now a DEIS school one of the key areas for school improvement action planning that we must focus on is Attendance. We are required to analyse our systems, to assist this, could we ask please that if your child is going to be late to school/or leaving early that you log the reason on Aladdin Connect. This can be completed in the same way as recording absences. It has come to our attention that many children have already missed a number of school days due to term time family holidays, whilst we understand the reasons for doing this, we strongly discourage taking children out of school for long periods during term time. Every school day counts! Under current legislation the school must notify the National Educational Welfare Board if a child is absent for 20 days or more.

GAA coaching continues for all until the Hallowe'en break and we thank Monaghan GAA coach Eamon Hughes for delivering an excellent skills programme to all.
